Layers of security

Security experts advise homeowners to **layer security systems**, SAPS refer to it as **target hardening.** High walls, electric fences, spikes, beams, CCTV cameras, burglar bars, alarms, dogs and motion sensor lights are all different layers security measures. Unfortunately none of these layers are impenetrable, the collective function of these is to make you less attractive to would be criminals and **buy you enough time** to call for help.

Community safety works in a very similar way. SAPS, Metro, Law Enforcement, Traffic, Armed Response Companies (ARC's), Neighbourhood Watches and street groups are all layers of community safety.

Communities play a **crucial link** in security and yet we so often undermine our roles in keeping each other safe, happy to assign this to external service providers. Unfortunately the current rate of crime in South Africa no longer affords us this luxury. Community members must step up to keep their neighbourhoods, families, homes and those that work in them safe. The good news is - It's really easy - **IF YOU SEE SOMETHING - SAY SOMETHING**. Be alert, join or start a street group, **report any and all suspicious behaviour** to your ARC, Log and upvote C3's, sign up to support the hardworking NGO's doing amazing things on our doorstep and open cases at SAPS if you are a victim of crime. These small actions collectively make a huge difference to keeping our community safe.

Milnerton Central Neighbourhood Watch (MCNW)

A neighbourhood watch (NW) works closely with local law enforcement agencies, **nurturing** a sense of **unity**, **dedication** and **good neighbourly** relations; creating awareness around safety and crime prevention while encouraging the community to work in close co-operation with all law enforcement structures. A NW serves as the **eyes and ears** for the community and the local police services, thereby contributing towards a safe and secure environment. A NW also provides a channel for the local community to **play a meaningful role** in the neighbourhood. MCNW is **not an armed response company**, but rather an initiative that seeks to unite our diverse residency and are dedicated to creating a stable, crime-free environment. MCNW is wholly **operated by volunteers**.

Community Policing Forum (CPF)

A **CPF** is the structure that establishes a **partnership** between the **community and the SAPS**. MCNW represents the Milnerton Central community at these monthly meetings and regularly participates in joint operations with SAPS, other law enforcement organisations and surrounding NW's. The CPF also provides an **environment** where neighbouring NW's can **discuss trends, raise awareness and offer support** to each other in the fight against crime.

Armed / Alarm Response Companies (ARCs)

Beyond a private security service, armed response companies are a very important support resource for SAPS - they patrol and respond to our community in a way that SAPS is not able. The MCNW works with all armed response companies currently working in Milnerton Central to address residents safety concerns.

National and Local Law Enforcement structures

South African Police Service (SAPS) - 10111



SAPS are mandated to prevent, combat and investigate crime, maintain public order, protect and secure the inhabitants of the Republic and their property while upholding and enforcing the law. SAPS deal with serious crimes: e.g. murder, rape, assault, robbery and theft. SAPS are the only organisation that can conduct criminal investigations and detain suspects.

The Cape Town Metropolitan Police - 021 480 7700



Metro Police is different from the SAPS. Their emphasis is more on preventing crime and reducing the cause. Metro Police don't investigate crimes, they help combat crimes such as murder, rape, theft and illegal drug use. Metro are mandated to secure municipal property, municipal bylaw enforcement, traffic control and crime prevention.

Law Enforcement (LE) 021 480 7700



Law Enforcement officers enforce City's bylaws, traffic laws and ensure general safety to public, clamping down on offences such as general nuisances, alcohol offences, problem buildings and illegal informal trading. LE officers may make arrests and can be appointed as traffic wardens, they also have the power to confiscate, arrest, issue compliance notices and fines, and shut down illegal operations where by-laws are infringed upon.
